- I. General Summary For Control Methods: American Pest Control, Inc.'s Integrated Pest Management Program would include:
 - A. Inspection of Building
 - 1. For Pest Infestation (includes insect collection with zone monitors)
 - 2. For Structural defects (conducive to pest infestations)
 - 3. For Operational Modifications (to help discover practices that can lead to pest problem)
 - B. Pest Sighting Report (For entry by any personnel reporting pest activity)
 - C. Recommendations for building & sanitation alteration found from inspections. (To correct problems found on the inspections.)
 - D. Pest Identification
 - E. Research for proper recommendations and to help find the source of the infestation.
 - F. Pest Activity Tolerance (Please see pages 2 and 3 in the IPM Guide in the back of this log book)
 - G. Treatment using lowest risk approach first.
 - 1. Structural & operational change preferred over insecticide use.
 - 2. Baits injected into cracks & containerized baits preferred over liquid insecticide use.
 - 3. Target treatment at source of infestation is preferred over general widespread treatment.
 - 4. Controlling rodents with traps and glueboards preferred over baits.
 - H. Documentation of A through H in this log book through the use of Inspection Report Sheets and floor plans.
- II. Service Schedule: In conjunction with the Director of Maintenance and Operation, we have decided not to have a rigid schedule for service. The monthly inspections will occur approximately thirty days apart. Service calls in between will be scheduled according to urgency and school schedules. A general service call is defined as having a minimum lead time. We will attempt to provide service on school holidays or after school hours wherever possible.
- III. Please find the Inspection Reports in the log book. An Inspection Report should be filled out each time we perform service.
- IV & V. Please also find in the log book copies of our company license, IDPH certifications for any service technician that may work, and MSD Sheets for any pesticide that we may need to use at this facility.
- VI. A floor plan should also be provided in this log book showing the location of rodent traps, glueboards, baits, and insect zone monitors or Low-liners.
