Every Canton student embraces individuality and is prepared, respectful, driven, and empowered to pursue their future.

Age: Students must be 5 years old on or before September $1^{\text {st }}$ to begin kindergarten.

Physical Examination and Immunization Requirements: Illinois law requires that all pupils must have a current physical examination and proof of immunization before entering preschool, kindergarten, sixth, and ninth grades. If the pupil didn't attend kindergarten, this physica examination and proof of immunization must be obtained before entering the first grade.

The state law requires that all children entering school be immunized against polio, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), measles ( 2 shots), rubella and mumps. Al children entering preschool and fifth through ninth grade must have received the Hepatitis B series of three immunizations. Preschool children must have received their Hib series which immunizes for influenza (flu). Preschool children are also now required to show proof of receiving one dose of varicella (chickenpox) on or after their first birthday Students must also have a lead screening test before entering kindergarten. Evidence of Health Examination and Immunization must be presented before students are allowed to enter preschool, kindergarten, sixth, or ninth grades.

Eye Exam and Dental Exam Requirements:
Eye exams are required for students entering kindergarten and for students new to the district. Dental exams are required for students entering kindergarten, second, sixth and ninth grades.

Birth Certificate: A certified copy of the official certificate of birth must be presented upon enrollment in kindergarten or by students new to the Canton school system.

Enrollment for First Time: Students enrolling in Canton Schools for the first time must present official records from their previous school, provide an official birth certificate meet physical examination and immunization requirements, and provide evidence of vision examination.

Textbook Rental and Fees: In addition to textbook renta fees, other instructional fees apply that are gradelevel/course specific. Students in financial need may apply for a waiver. Eligibility guidelines and application forms are available at each school.

## Insurance

Student Insurance is available to all students as a secondary insurance. Information on policies and claim procedures can be obtained at the District Administration Building located at 20 W Walnut St, Canton, IL 61520

Food Service: Each school has a breakfast and a lunch program available to students.

Student discipline: Canton District 66 maintains a ParentTeacher Discipline Advisory Committee which meets annually to review district discipline policies. Disciplinary measures include, but are not limited to, the following: expulsion, suspension, and removal from the classroom, denial of privileges, probation, or detention. Prior to receiving a disciplinary action, the student shall be given the opportunity to deny or explain his or her misconduct to the classroom teacher and/or building administrators. No disciplinary measure may include slapping, paddling, or prolonged maintenance of students in physically painful positions nor shall it include the intentional infliction of bodily harm. Disciplinary rules are distributed to parents and guardians.

Harassment: It is the policy of Canton Union School District \#66 to provide for it employees and students an environment free from any behavior which could be construed as harassment. Complaints relative to this policy may be reported verbally or in writing to any supervisor, principal, counselor, or the Superintendent.

Emergencies and Severe Weather: To determine if the schools will open in extreme weather, PARENTS ARE ASKED NOT TO CALL THE CENTRAL OFFICE OR RADIO STATION. Parents will be alerted by an automated telephone message through the district's Skylert Messaging System. Information will also be available on the district website, Canton radio station WBYS, and local television stations. During the tornado season, WBYS broadcasts the authoritative source of warning information. In cases of a tornado warning during school hours, pupils will be kept in the buildings until the warning is lifted. Each school has a disaster plan, as well as a fire emergency plan.

Each school is equipped with an emergency radio which is in direct contact with the weather reporting bureaus.

The decision to close or the delay school during severe winter weather is based upon the following information:

1. Early (before 6 a.m.) personal inspection of road conditions by school personnel.
2. Contact with road commissioners.
3. Contact with strategically located families and bus drivers.
4. The latest weather information.

The decision to close or to delay school is made as early as possible and posted on the district website, radio station WBYS (1560 AM) and television stations Ch. 19 HOI, 25 WEEK and Ch. 31 WMBD, in addition to a Skylert telephone message to parents. A delayed start means classes will start on hour later and buses will run one hour later. Parents are urged to listen to their radio for school closing information.

Illness and Injuries: If your child becomes ill or is injured during the school day, please have a definite place the child may go if you are not at home. An emergency telephone number is needed for each child.

Medication: District procedures on the Administration of Medication to Students are explained in school handbooks Parents should become familiar with these procedures.

District 66 Transportation: School-owned buses provide free service, morning and afternoon, for all pupils who reside 1.5 miles or farther from schools. Bus routes, which change somewhat yearly, are announced in community newspapers shortly before school opens.

High school student who are properly licensed and insured may purchase a parking permit so that they may drive a motor vehicle to school. Students who drive in an unsafe manner will lose the privilege to drive to school.

Each bus student will receive a list of regulations governing school bus riders. It is recommended that all riders, parents of riders, and teachers become thoroughly familiar with the regulations. Students failing to observe bus regulations will be referred to their building principals. The building principal and the bus driver will decide what disciplinary action needs to be taken, if any. Parents should talk with the building principal concerning discipline problems on the buses.

Transportation information may be obtained by calling 6471415.

WALKING: The City of Canton stations guards at hazardous street crossings near elementary schools. The guards regulate motor traffic and supervise pupils morning and afternoon.

## School Boundaries:

Eastview: 1. Everything East of CB\&Q Railroad Tracks (Excluding \#2 of Westview boundaries). North to and including Corporation Street. 2. Sebree Rd., around to and including Boat Dock Rd. 3. Canton Lake Area, East of Bradley Corner and all of the Orion Area. 4. Everything on Route 9 (East), Monterey, and the area South of Monterey. 5. Breeds, Banner, Rice Lake, and Duck Island Area. There are some exceptions to equalize enrollments.
Westview: 1. CB\&Q Railroad Tracks and everything West of it (excluding \#6 of Lincoln boundaries). North to, but not including Sycamore. 2. $4^{\text {th }}$ Ave. South of Elm Street to East Pine, East to S. $6^{\text {th }}$ Ave., South to E. Maple, East to S. $8^{\text {th }}$ Ave., South to Anderson Pl., East to S. 9 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Ave., and everything South to the City Limits (excluding Federal Housing at 1002 E Oak St.) 3. Everything West to Main St. from TP\&O Railroad Tracks South to Cherry St. 4. South of City Limits West of Route 78 to Route 100. 5. Rural Area, Both North and South sides of Canton-Cuba blacktop (West Hickory and route 9 (West) area. There are some exceptions to equalize enrollments.
Lincoln: 1. Everything North of Corporation on the East side of Main St. to and including $11^{\text {th }}$ Ave. including Country Club Apartments at 55 E. Cypress. 2. Sycamore Terrace and everything North of it on the West side of Main Street.
3. Brereton Area and Norris Area. 4. Rural Area-South of Route 9 (East) to Route 78. 5. 78 (South) South of the City Limits to District Line beyond Maples Mill. 6. Everything South of TP\&W Railroad Tracks and West of CB\& Q Railroad Tracks and East of Main Street to City Limits. Also, area West of South Main including Tamarack to the City limits. 7. Federal Housing (1002 E. Oak St.). There are some exceptions to equalize enrollments.

Special Education Services: Canton Union School District No. 66 provides for its special education services by membership in the West Central Illinois Special Education Cooperative. Canton Schools offer a free and appropriate education to all children. Any child, ages 3-21, whose parents or legal guardians reside in the school district is eligible for special education services if the child's impairment is determined to interfere with his or her educational progress as determined by a multi-disciplinary staffing. The kinds of impairments for which services can be provided are visual, hearing, physical, speech/language, learning disability, emotional/behavioral, health impaired, intellectual disability, autism, and traumatic brain injury.

The school district provides an annual screening of all children between the ages of 3 and 5 , hearing and vision screening at regular intervals and ongoing annual screening by teachers and other professional personnel for referral of those children who exhibit problems which interfere with their educational progress and/or their adjustment to the educational setting. All kindergarten students are screened for dyslexia and other reading disabilities. Referrals for preliminary evaluation in Canton schools may be made through the building principal by school district personnel, the parents of the child, community service agencies, persons having primary care and custody, other professional persons having knowledge of the child's problems, the child, or the State Board of Education when there is reason to believe that a child may require special education services.

Community members and parents may review a copy of the Notice of Procedural Safeguards for Parents/Guardians of Students With Disabilities at the CUSD \#66 Administration Office, 20 West Walnut Street, Canton, Illinois.

Right to Know: Parents/guardians have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of any teacher that is instructing their children. Parents/guardians may request information regarding the following: (a) Whether or not the teacher has met state certification requirements; (b) Whether or not the teacher is teaching under emergency or provisional status; (c) The bachelor's degree major of the teacher, any other certification or degrees held by the teacher and the subject areas of the certification or degrees; and (d) Whether your child is provided services by teacher aides/paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

## Instructional Material Notification

A student's parent(s)/guardian(s) may inspect, upon their request, any instructional material used as part of their child/ward's educational curriculum within a reasonable time of their request. The term "instructional material" means instructional content that is provided to a student, regardless of its format, printed or representational materials, audio-visual materials, and materials in electronic or digital formats (such as materials accessible through the internet). The term does not include academic tests or academic assessments.

## Length of School Day:

The length of the school day is as follows:

School Libraries: Each building maintains a comprehensive media center which is the academic core of the school. Students are encouraged to make full use of the books and other materials available in these centers. One media specialist and seven library assistants manage and supervise these facilities. Fees are not charged for regular usage but students are responsible for lost, damaged, or overdue materials.

## School Communication Procedures

When the need arises, parents should first make every effort to find a solution with the child's teacher. If no satisfactory solution is found, the channel of appeal is to the principal, to the superintendent, and finally to the Board of Education. Every effort will be made to find fair and equitable solutions to all problems. Parents are encouraged to contact teachers by using INFONET at 309-647-3400.

## ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), Canton Union School District \#66 is required to publish notification that asbestos containing materials are present in district buildings. ## PARENT NOTIFICATION:

## NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA AND THE ILLINOIS SCHOOL RECORDS ACT

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) afford parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:
(1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 15 days of the day the District receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parents or eligible students of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
(2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parents or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading.

The parents or eligible student may ask Canton Union School District \#66 to amend records that they believe are inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parents or eligible student, the District will notify the parents or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided at that time.
(3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA or the Illinois School Records Act authorized Disclosure without consent.
One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the District as an administrator, a supervisor, an instructor, or a support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, an auditor, a medical consultant, or a therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee such as disciplinary or grievance committee or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the District discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student intends to enroll.
(4) The right to a copy of any school student record proposed to be destroyed or deleted.

Permanent student records are maintained for 60 years. Temporary records are maintained for five years after the student has graduated, transferred or permanently withdrawn. Requests for Copies during that time may be directed to the school principal.
(5) The right to prohibit the release of directory information concerning the parent's/guardian's child.

Throughout the school year, the District may release directory information regarding students, limited to: name; address; gender; grade level; birth date and place; parents'/guardians' names and addresses; academic awards, degrees, and honors; information in relation to school-sponsored activities, organizations, and athletics; major field of study; and period of attendance in school. Any parent(s)/Guardian(s) or eligible student may prohibit the release of any or all of the above information by delivering a written objection to the Building Principal within 30 days of the date of This notice. No directory information will be released within this time period, unless the parent(s)/guardian(s) or eligible student are specifically informed otherwise.
(6) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is:
